



STATE OF TENNESSEE EXECUTIVE ORDER BY THE GOVERNOR

AN EMERGENCY ORDER AMENDING CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF EXECUTIVE ORDER No. 65 RELATED TO EMERGENCY RELIEF

WHEREAS, in response to the emergency conditions existing in the aftermath of recent devastating storms and flooding, the Tennessee Emergency Management Plan was activated on May 1, 2010, thereby declaring a state of emergency in Tennessee; and

WHEREAS, Tennessee Code Annotated § 58-2-107(e)(1) provides that during a state of emergency, the Governor is authorized to "suspend the provisions of any law, order, rule or regulation prescribing the procedures for the conduct of state business or the orders or rules or regulations of any state agency, if strict compliance with the provisions of any such law, order, rule, or regulation would in any way prevent, hinder, or delay necessary action in coping with the emergency"; and

WHEREAS, in Executive Order No. 65, I suspended temporarily several state laws and rules in order to cope with the current emergency situation; and

WHEREAS, in order to continue to provide needed assistance to those Tennesseans impacted by the devastating weather events May 1 and May 2 of 2010, I have determined that it is necessary to amend certain provisions of Executive Order No. 65.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Phil Bredesen, Governor of the State of Tennessee, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me by the Tennessee Constitution and law, do hereby order and direct the following:

 Paragraph numbers one (1) and two (2) of Executive Order No. 65, related to the suspension of certain provisions of Tenn. Code Ann. § 55-7-201 et seq., Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs, Chapter 1680-7-1, Tenn. Code Ann. § 55-4-121 and Tenn. Code Ann. § 67-3-1202 are hereby amended to extend the suspension of such state laws and rules until 12:00 a.m., Central Daylight Time, on June 30, 2010.
