## 1660-01-28-.05 APPRENTICE HUNTER EDUCATION EXEMPTION - ELIGIBILITY AND CONDITIONS.

(1) The Apprentice Hunter Education Exemption will be required for all hunters 10 years of age or older who have not completed the mandatory hunter education course as specified in T.C.A. § 70-2-108. The Apprentice Hunter Education Exemption will exempt the hunter for a period of one year from time of purchase from having to complete the mandatory hunter education course. This exemption can only be purchased three consecutive years in the lifetime of the hunter.

(2) Hunters who are required to possess the Apprentice Hunter Education Exemption must be accompanied by an adult 21 years of age or older, who must meet the hunter education requirements as specified in T.C.A. § 70-2-108.

#### 1660-01-28-.06 FACILITY FISHING LICENSE - ELIGIBILITY AND CONDITIONS.

- (1) This license is available at no cost upon written request by a representative employee of a facility located in Tennessee (i.e., hospital, residence or school) that desires to hold a recreational fishing event for residents, students or patients with physical or mental disabilities or for elderly group home residents as part of a medically approved therapy. A representative of the facility must supervise the participants at all times.
- (2) Such written request must be sent to the Executive Director of TWRA at least two (2) weeks prior to the event. The license is good for only one fishing event or trip, not to exceed three (3) days. If further events or additional days are desired, another written request must be made. All fishing must be done in compliance with state laws, rules and regulations and proclamations.

## 1660-01-28-.07 PERMITS AND FEES FOR TIER ONE HUNTER EDUCATION CENTERS AND PUBLIC FIRING RANGES.

Tier One Ranges shall include: Cheatham WMA, Catoosa WMA, Prentice Cooper WMA, North Cumberland WMA, Chuck Swan WMA, and Yanahli WMA firing ranges.

- (a) Permit Fees:
  - 1. Adult (16 years of age and older) \$5.00 per 2 hours.
  - 2. Adult Annual Permit (16 years of age and older) \$100.00.
  - 3. Classroom Permit \$50.00 per hour or \$150 per day (up to 8 hours.)
  - 4. Surcharge of \$61.00 for after-hour use of facilities in addition to regular rates.

## 1660-01-28-.09 PERMITS AND FEES FOR TIER THREE HUNTER EDUCATION CENTERS AND PUBLIC FIRING RANGES.

(1) Permits and Fees for Tier Three Ranges:

Tier Three Ranges shall include Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency Hunter Education Center and Firing Range (Bartlett).

- (a) Permit Fees:
  - 1. Adult (16 years of age and older) \$9.50 per hour.
  - 2. Adult Annual Permit (16 years of age and older) \$300.00.
  - 3. Classroom Permit \$50.00 per hour or \$150 per day (up to 8 hours.)
  - 4. Surcharge of \$61.00 for after-hour use of facilities in addition to regular rates.

### 1660-01-28-.10 LICENSES FOR HUNTING, TRAPPING, AND FISHING GUIDE SERVICES.

Licenses are set out as follows:

Resident Guide License	\$150.00

A guide is any individual who accepts compensation for providing assistance to another in any act of hunting, fishing and/or trapping and shall be required to possess a guide license.

Entities employing individuals as guides may purchase such resident and non-resident guide licenses as may be necessary for its employees.

#### 1660-01-28-.11 NATIVE TENNESSEAN ANNUAL LICENSE.

- (1) Non-residents who were born in Tennessee may apply for Native Tennessean annual licenses, which provide non-residents who were originally born in the state but who no longer reside in the state, the opportunity to purchase annual Tennessee hunting/fishing/trapping licenses at the same cost as residents.
- (2) Applicants for a Native Tennessean annual license must provide a certified copy of the original birth certificate showing that the applicant was born in the state of Tennessee and/or that the parent's address was in the state of Tennessee at the time of birth as shown on the certified birth certificate, as well as a valid current photo identification.
- (3) First-time applicants for the Native Tennessean annual license must submit their application to the Agency. Native Tennessean annual license will be identical to annual resident licenses sold by the Agency, but will be properly designated "Native Tennessean."
- (4) All regular annual licenses currently offered to residents will be made available to applicants who qualify as Native Tennesseans. Lifetime licenses will not be included in the Native Tennessean license program.

### 1660-01-28-.13 EXPIRATION OF LICENSES AND PERMITS.

- (1) Pursuant to T.C.A. § 70-2-107, the traditional license year, beginning March 1 of each year and lasting until the last day of February the following year, is hereby abolished. An annual license system is established as set forth in paragraph (2).
- (2) Each license or permit issued under these rules must be dated when issued. Each license or permit issued under these rules is valid for twelve (12) months after the date of issuance, except for the following:
  - (a) Lifetime sportsman license (Type 401, 402, 403, 404, 405, 406, and adoptive lifetime license created under T.C.A. § 70-2-201), which is valid from the date of issuance until the death of the license holder;

- (b) Permanent license or permit (Type 166, 169, 189, 197, 198, and 199), which is valid from the date of issuance until the death of the license or permit holder;
- (c) Falconry permit (Type 117, 122, and 123), which expires on June 30 of the third year from the date of issuance;
- (d) Permit issued to a successful quota hunt applicant, which is valid for the period specified on the quota permit;
- (e) Short-term license or permit (Type 21, 23, 36, 38, 65, 72, 74, 77, 78, 79, 80, 85, 88, 90, 92, 96, 97, 98, 99, and 191), which is valid for the period specified on the license or permit;
- (f) Short-term range permit (Set forth in Tenn. Comp. R. & Regs. 1660-01-28-.07, -.08, and -.09), which is valid for the period specified on the permit;
- (g) Migratory bird permit (Type 06) which is valid for the period specified on the permit; and
- (h) Permit for captive wildlife (Type 124, 125, 150, 160, 161, 170, 171, 172, 173, 174, 175, and 176), which expires on June 30 of each year.
