1680-2-2-.01 AREA RESTRICTIONS.

- (1) Cutting and baling of hay may be performed in the median of the interstate highway right-of-way or in other areas which have been approved by the Regional Landscape Supervisor. Cutting and baling of hay is prohibited in areas designated as regeneration areas, seedling areas, crown vetch areas, wild flower areas, rest areas and welcome station areas.
- (2) Areas must be of sufficient width such that equipment maneuvers may be executed without encroachment on paved areas of the highway and shoulder.
- (3) Due to traffic congestion in urban areas, mowing and baling activities shall be confined to rural areas.
- (4) Each permit issued shall be valid for a maximum area of fifty (50) acres or for three (3) miles in length as measured parallel to the interstate highway.

1680-2-2-.02 PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS.

- (1) Permittee shall perform the operations of cutting, baling, hauling of hay, and equipment mobilization and demobilization between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. Mobilization and demobilization of over-dimensional equipment shall be restricted to the hours between 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m.
- (2) Permittee shall not perform the operations of mowing and baling and equipment mobilization or demobilization on Saturdays, Sundays or Official State Holidays. Furthermore, Permittee shall not perform these operations at any time in which weather conditions (including fog) contribute to reduced visibility for motorists on the area highway.
- (3) The Regional Maintenance Engineer or his representative shall be given 24 hour advance notice as to those days on which Permittee plans to mobilize equipment at the operation site, and as to those days on which Permittee plans to perform authorized cutting and baling activities.
- (4) If machinery operations are performed within twenty (20) feet of the edge of the interstate shoulder, Permittee shall be responsible for placement of signs that conform with standards set forth in the Tennessee Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices For Streets and Bridges. These required signs, which must be removed each evening are as follows:

(Rule 1680-2-2-.02, continued)

- (a) A sign bearing the message, "Farm Machinery-One Mile" will be placed one mile in advance of operation.
- (b) A sign bearing the message, "End Work" will be placed 500 feet beyond the mowing limit.
- (5) Parking, loading and/or off-loading of equipment on paved shoulders is prohibited.
- (6) All cutting and baling equipment shall be removed from the interstate right-of-way each night, unless the equipment may be parked in a place such that guard rails or existing natural barriers provide protection for the interstate motorists. Any such overnight site must be approved by the Regional Maintenance Engineer or his representative.
- (7) Permittee shall not cut the hay to a height less than three (3) inches.
- (8) The removal of controlled-access fences to facilitate ingress and egress to the right-of-way is strictly prohibited.
- (9) Any damages to the right-of-way (roadway, appurtenances, vegetation, etc.) incurred during the performance of cutting and baling activity shall be repaired and/or replaced at the expense of the Permittee.
- (10) At the completion of the hay harvest, the entire area involved shall be left in a neat and orderly condition. Any litter attributable to the harvesting operation shall be removed.
- (11) Hay and grass on areas normally mowed by maintenance forces will not be allowed to grow to excessive heights.
- (12) An authorized permit to cut and bale hay will be valid for fourteen (14) weekdays (holidays excluded), on any one location. Baled hay which has not been removed from the right-of-way upon expiration of the permit will become the property of and be removed by the Department of Transportation.

1680-2-2-.03 PERMIT APPLICATION PROCEDURE.

- (1) All applications for permits to cut and bale hay along interstate right-of-way in Tennessee, shall be submitted to the State Department of Transportation, Office of the Regional Engineer at one of the following locations nearest to the proposed cutting and baling site:

- (2) The application shall include the following. (See Application Form, 1680-2-2-.05)
 - (a) A statement establishing that the applicant is a resident of Tennessee and that the harvested hay will be used for personal farming purposes only and will not be sold.
 - (b) A description of the proposed location at which the applicant desires to cut and bale hay.
 - (c) In the event the Regional Engineer approves the location, he shall advise the applicant. At this time the applicant must provide the Regional Engineer with the following:
 - 1. A certificate of insurance which provides the following coverage:
 - (i) Minimum liability insurance in the amount of \$50,000 for bodily injury or death to any one person in a single accident, plus,
 - (ii) \$100,000 for bodily injury or death to two or more persons in a single accident, plus,
 - (iii) \$10,000 for injury to or destruction of property in a single accident.
 - 2. A \$2,500 surety performance bond for each permit requested by the applicant.
 - (d) Upon receiving the certificate of insurance and surety performance bond, the Regional Engineer shall issue a letter of authorization to the applicant. (See Sample Letter of Authorization, 1680-2-2-.06)
 - (e) Under no circumstances shall the applicant proceed with cutting and baling operations until he has received the Letter of Authorization.

1680-2-2-.04 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS.

- (1) Permittee will defend and hold the Department of Transportation, its officers and employees harmless from any claims or actions by any person against the Department of Transportation, its officers and employees as a result of Permittee's hay harvesting operation.
- (2) At all times, the safety of the interstate motorists and the Perrnittee shall be of utmost importance. The rules and regulations contained in this Chapter are not intended to relieve Permittee from compliance with other safety regulations required by local, state or federal law.
