### Statement of Necessity:

The Appropriations Act, Public Chapter 453, effective July 1, 2013, requires the Bureau of TennCare to reduce expenditures for generic prescription drugs. The reduction will be accomplished by implementing a copay of \$1.50 per generic prescription. This change to the TennCare Program required an amendment to the TennCare II section 1115 Medicaid demonstration waiver, which was approved July 16, 2013, by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) with an effective date of October 1, 2013.

The TennCare population affected by this change is currently subject to \$3.00 copays for brand name prescription drugs and consists of Medicaid adults who do not qualify for federal exemption from copays, Standard enrollees under age 21 with incomes at or above 100% of the poverty level or age 21 and older in the Spend Down program, and CHOICES 3 enrollees.

T.C.A. § 4-5-208 permits an agency to adopt an emergency rule when it is required by enactment of the general assembly to implement rules within a prescribed period of time that precludes utilization of rulemaking procedures for promulgation of permanent rules. It further permits adoption of an emergency rule when it is required by an agency of the federal government and adoption of the rule through ordinary rulemaking procedures might jeopardize the loss of federal funds.

Based upon the above information, I have made the finding that the emergency adoption of this rule is required in order to achieve implementation by October 1, 2013.

Subparagraph (c) of Paragraph (2) of Rule 1200-13-14-.05 Enrollee Cost sharing is deleted in its entirety and replaced with a new Subparagraph (c) which shall read as follows:

- (c) Pharmacy copays. The following TennCare Standard enrollees have pharmacy copays of \$3.00 per covered brand name prescription and \$1.50 per covered generic prescription:
  - 1. TennCare Standard children with family incomes that are 100% of poverty or greater.
  - 2. Enrollees in the Standard Spend Down program.
  - 3. Enrollees in the CHOICES At-Risk Demonstration Group.

Columns three "Copay if income is 100%-199% of poverty" and four "Copay if income is 200% of poverty or greater" of the "Prescription or refill" row of the copay table of Subparagraph (d) of Paragraph (2) of Rule 1200-13-14-.05 Enrollee Cost Sharing is amended by deleting the language "\$0 for generic prescriptions" and replacing it with new language "and \$1.50 for covered generic prescriptions" so as amended Subparagraph (d) shall read as follows:

(d) Copays for other TennCare services. The following copays are applicable to TennCare Standard children.

The rules implement a \$1.50 copay for generic prescription drugs obtained by TennCare enrollees who currently have a \$3.00 copay for brand name drugs.

The Rules are lawfully adopted by the Bureau of TennCare as an emergency rule under T.C.A. § 4-5-208, under TennCare's rulemaking authority at TCA §§ 71-5-105 and 109, and as required by the Appropriations Act of 2013 and by amendment to the TennCare Waiver approved by CMS effective October 1, 2013.

The persons and entities most directly affected by these rules are the TennCare enrollees, providers and the managed care contractors. The governmental entity most directly affected by these Rules is the Bureau of TennCare, Tennessee Department of Finance and Administration.
